RULES & REGULATIONS



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1. ENROLMENT & ADMISSION PROCESS FOR GRADE RR - 9

- 1.1. Applicant writes an entry exam on 3 or more subjects (as per the School's discretion) at the school premises at a non-refundable fee of N\$400
- 1.2. The School interviews applicant & parents/guardians
- 1.3. The School reviews the Confidential Report from the student's previous school, if applicable
- 1.4. Applicant attends a 20-day trial-period at the school (as per the School's discretion)
- 1.5. The School gives written notification if application was successful or unsuccessful
- 1.6. Grade 1 applicants (that did <u>not</u> attend Grade R at Henties Bay Private School) will need to undergo a School Readiness Assessment by a qualified practitioner before applying

2. FEES

- 2.1. Annual Registration Fees are paid yearly by all enrolled students before the start of a new school year
- 2.2. School Fees are paid over 12 months (first payment on 1 January and last payment on 1 December)
- 2.3. Aside from Registration and school fees, school events like Valentine's day, Sports day, School concert, Spring day etc will have additional costs payable by all enrolled students
- 2.4. See REGISTRATION, SCHOOL & OTHER FEES document for all fees

5. SNOEPIE

- 5.1. Snoepie will be available daily during first break. In addition to the regular snoepie items, toasted sandwiches and pies will also be for sale.
- 5.2. The snoepie will have a speciality item every Friday. These are made to order and orders can be placed by the respective home-class teachers on/before every Thursday 13h00.

6. SCHOOL FEES & ANNUAL REGISTRATION FEES PRICE INCREASE

- 6.1. Fees for the next year will be made known during the month of September/October of the current year (see REGISTRATION, SCHOOL & OTHER FEES document)
- 6.2. Although the school will endeavour to keep fee increases to a minimum (5% 10%), the school's Annual Registration Fees will be adjusted accordingly.



7. PAYMENT PROCEDURE: ANNUAL REGISTRATION FEES

- 7.1. A non-refundable Annual Registration Fee is payable yearly for all enrolled students
- 7.2. Registration Fees of <u>new applicants</u> are payable within 7 days of written notice of successful application
- 7.3. Re-registration Fees of current students are payable on/or before **30 October** to ensure placement for next year
- 7.4. Study material will only be ordered once Registration Fees are paid in full
- 7.5. Registration Fees for the following year will be made known during September/October of the current year.
- 7.6. Included in the Registration Fees are:
 - 7.6.1. Use of study guides: Grade 1-9
 - 7.6.2. Study material, art supplies, workbooks: Pre-Primary
 - 7.6.3. All study notes and summaries
 - 7.6.4. All photocopies (black & white and colour)
 - 7.6.5. All Exam papers, Test papers, Portfolio worksheets
 - 7.6.6. All study guides, workbooks, copies, exams, tests and portfolio worksheets are the property of Henties Bay Private School and are to be handed in at the end of each school year
 - 7.6.7. The school will charge the parent a 100% replacement fee should study guides not be returned in an acceptable condition at the end of each year

8. PAYMENT PROCEDURE: MONTHLY SCHOOL FEES

- 8.1. Monthly School Fees to be paid on or before 1st of every month
- 8.2. Student will not be allowed entry to the school and will not be allowed to attend any extramural activities that are included in the monthly fees in the case of outstanding school fees
- 8.3. The school reserves the right to cancel a student's enrolment at any time without any notice period due to unpaid fees
- 8.4. Outstanding fees at the end of a term or year will result in the student receiving no report card and in the case of outstanding fees at the end of a year, the student will not be allowed to enrol for the following year

12. CANCELLATION OF ENROLMENT / EXPULSION / DETENTION

- 12.1. Written cancellation must be received by the school one (1) months in advance if a parent/guardian wishes to cancel his/her child's enrolment. Please note that a cancellation fee will be charged regardless of written cancellation.
- 12.2. Notice must be given in October as November does not serve as a notice month. School Fees for December will still be payable in full.
- 12.3. Parent/Guardian are liable for the amount equal to one (1) months' school fees in the event of cancellation without the proper notice period.
- 12.4. Parents/Guardians are liable for a cancellation fee upon cancellation of enrolment.
- 12.5. The school reserves the right to cancel the enrolment of a student at any time due to unpaid/outstanding fees

13. STUDENT ABSENTEEISM

- 13.1. In the event of a student being ill, the school must be notified on the office phone (+264 81 712 6605)
- 13.2. Should a student be absent on a Friday or a Monday, a doctor's letter will be required.
- 13.3. Any other student absences must be applied for (Student Leave of Absence Request form) at least 3 days in advance.
- 13.4. Any work missed by the student will be placed in a file on the reception desk. The student or the student's parent/guardian will be responsible to physically collect and sign for this file as well as to collect any other study material needed.
- 13.5. If a student requires additional guidance on how to complete the missed lessons with the subject teacher, parents are welcome to inquire when that teacher will be on afternoon duty in order to assist the student.

- 14.1.2.1. 3 Written notes (when a student receives his/her third Written Note, a detention session will be booked for the first available Friday as noted on the Teacher's calendar)
- 14.1.2.2. Disruptive & disrespectful behaviour
- 14.1.2.3. Act of dishonesty
- 14.1.2.4. Littering

14.1.3. TEMPORARY EXPULSION OF A STUDENT (1 – 14 DAYS)

- 14.1.3.1. Non-attendance without a doctor's note and or leaving the school without permission
- 14.1.3.2. Open defiance and rudeness
- 14.1.3.3. Smoking on school premises
- 14.1.3.4. Carrying a cellphone

14.1.4. IMMEDIATE AND PERMANENT EXPULSION OF STUDENT

- 14.1.4.1. Vandalism/Damage related offences on or off school property
- 14.1.4.2. Gangsterism (extortion, intimidation, threatening and bullying behaviour)
- 14.1.4.3. Cheating in tests/examinations
- 14.1.4.4. Assault, fighting and/or bullying on or off school property
- 14.1.4.5. Theft and shoplifting on or off school property
- 14.1.4.6. Using/selling of any alcohol, tobacco products or drugs
- 14.1.4.7. Bringing inappropriate items to school (blade weapons, guns, pellet guns, sex toys)

15. PARENTAL BEHAVIOUR

- 15.1. The school reserves the right to cancel a student's enrolment with immediate effect in the event of parental misbehaviour. We expect the following:
 - 15.1.1. That adults set a good example to children always, showing them how to get along with all members of the school and the wider community
 - 15.1.2. That no members of staff, parents or children are the victims of abusive behaviour or open to threats from other adults on the school premises
 - 15.1.3. Physical attacks and threatening behaviour, abusive or insulting language (verbal or written), to staff, parents and guardians, children and other users of the school premises will not be tolerated

16. SCHOOL RULES

- 16.1. Students are to arrive in the proper uniform and grooming. Non-compliance of uniform and grooming policy will result in disciplinary action. It is expected of students older than 10 years of age to wear deodorant daily.
- 16.2. While in class or at school, students are expected to strictly refrain from:
 - 16.2.1. Making jokes
 - 16.2.2. Excessive noise/laughing



- 16.2.3. Pulling pranks on peers or teachers
- 16.2.4. Negotiation of rules as set out by school
- 16.2.5. Students are to stand up from their seats and formally greet any teacher, parent or adult they encounter at the school
- 16.3. Students are expected to treat their peers & teachers with the utmost of respect during and after school hours
- 16.4. No student can bring a cellphone onto the premises of the school. Any cellphone found on the school premises will be confiscated for the remainder of the year. Confiscated cellphones will be clearly marked with the owner's details and stored in a lockable safe on the premises.
- 16.5. No student can leave the premises of the school without supervision and/or permission from the school
- 16.6. Any student caught, handling, buying, selling or using illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco products will be permanently expelled with immediate effect
- 16.7. Students enrolled at the school are not permitted inside a pub/bar
- 16.8. No bullying, hazing, physical assault or verbal/physical threats towards other students, teachers or parents will be allowed
- 16.9. Students will be permanently expelled should they engage in any criminal activity (vandalism, damage to property, theft, shoplifting)
- 16.10. Students are prohibited from using profanity, vulgar language or obscene gestures whatever the circumstances
- 16.11. Students are not allowed to throw dangerous objects than can cause bodily injury or damage property
- 16.12. Students are strictly prohibited from any form of "play-fighting"
- 16.13. The chewing of gum is not permitted when in school uniform or at school functions
- 16.14. The school reserves the right to administer random drug tests on students for Cocaine, Tik, Ecstasy, Heroin and/or Dagga.
- 16.15. Parents are to collect students in the Preschool grades from <u>inside</u> the classroom. Under no circumstances will these students be allowed to leave the premises unless accompanied by a parent/quardian or an adult appointed by the parent/quardian.

17. GROOMING

- 17.1. Be neat and tidy always
- 17.2. Wear deodorant daily (10 years and older)
- 17.3. Short, clean nails
- 17.4. No nail polish allowed
- 17.5. Nails may not extend past fingertips
- 17.6. No acrylic nails allowed
- 17.7. No make-up other than base (girls)
- 17.8. Tie up long hair with navy, blue or coral orange accessories (girls)
- 17.9. Neat, short haircut that does not touch collar or obstruct eyes (boys)
- 17.10. No hair may hang in front of the eyes
- 17.11. No exotic hairstyles or dyed hair
- 17.12. No jewellery except for one pair of studs (small) or sleeper (small hoops) earrings (1 cm) (girls) and a wristwatch (blue, black, white, grey, silver, gold colours only)
- 17.13. No visible tattoos or piercings
- 17.14. No beards or moustaches allowed (boys)



18. UNIFORM

- 18.1. Please fill out a UNIFORM ORDER form for school and sportswear
- 18.2. Full payment to accompany the form. The school will not accept any uniform orders unless full payment or proof of payment accompanies the order form.
- 18.3. Items not ordered at the school, will be available from all major retailers (Woolworths, Ackermans, etc)
